The Xiamen Marathon in Xiamen City China surprised a select set of runners who ordinary leave races with little fanfare. The race, which attracts around 30,000 registrants, this year awarded gift bags to the non-finishers.

The DNF gift bags were not made public by Xtep beforehand, which ended up being a surprise to many runners. Written on the Xtep DNF gift bag was the term: "It's okay, come again."

The bags reportedly included an Xtep running shirt, a discount on their next purchase of shoes, and a written note that said:

"To the unfinished steps:
You may not have passed the

surpassed your previous self. At
every step, you fought against
giving up. Every drop of sweat is
in the shape of a dream.

the journey in the process.







